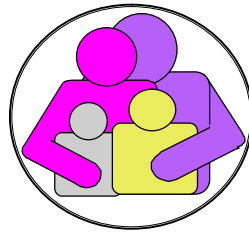

Target audience

The course is aimed at educators in primary care who are involved in teaching at the university or practice level. We expect experienced teachers and also those on the beginning of their educational careers.

SOCIAL EVENTS:

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The course will be held in English, located in Bled, Slovenia. Bled is a tourist resort in the Northwest of Slovenia on the border to Italy and Austria and is easily accessible by car, train or plane. The nearest airport Ljubljana is only 25 km away. The price of bed & breakfast ranges from 46 to 66 EUR per night per person. Reservation requests will be confirmed on a *first come, first served basis*. The deadline is August 20th. In the case that your choice at that time is no longer available an alternative accommodation will be offered by the organisers.



The course fee is set at **300 EURO** (V.A.T. included) and will include organisation of the course, course attendance, fieldwork, refreshments during the breaks, lunch during lunch breaks from Tuesday to Friday and the participation in exciting social events including farewell dinner. EURACT members pay a reduced fee of **250 EURO** (V.A.T. included), members of VdGM group pay **120 EURO** (V.A.T. included).
